Kalappanavar, Medical Director, SSIMS and RC, Dr. Aswin Kumar, Professor, Department of Community Medicine and Nodal Officer, NTEP, Dr. Jayasimha V L, Professor & Head, Dept. of Microbiology, and Dr. Asha B, Associate Professor, Dept. of Community Medicine and organizing secretary of CME.

COVID VACCINATION - 1

With the measures to contain the spread of COVID -19 pandemic, initiation of COVID vaccination was done on 18th January 2021 throughout the country. SSIMSRC was identified as one of the vaccination centres to deliver the COVID vaccine to the health care workers.

Under this massive drive, free doses of COVID vaccine (Covishield) was administered to all the health care workers attached to SSIMSRC, Davangere. A total of 2355 doses were administered in the first and second phase. Around 66% of the health care workers in SSIMSRC were vaccinated.

Under COWIN 2.0., till date, COVID vaccination was administered to 1066 beneficiaries (> 60 years, 45-59 years with co-morbidities, health care workers and front line workers). Dr. Neha S Mokashi, MD, OBG, Health Care Worker was the 1000th Person getting the COVISHIELD vaccine in SSIMSRC.

COVID VACCINATION - 2

Under this massive drive to contain the spread of COVID infection in Davangere district, free doses of Covid vaccine (Covishield) was administered to all the general public (18-45 years and >45 years) at various sites of Davangere city. The activity was carried out by department of community medicine along with other departments of SSIMSRC, Davangere.

An inaugural function for free vaccination drive was arranged on 4.6.21 at Durgambika temple, Davangere. It was inaugurated by Shri. D.K. Shivakumar, President of KPCC, presided by Dr. Shamanur Shivashankrappaji, MLA, South Davangere. Shri. S.S. Mallikarjun, Chaiman, SSIMSRC and Ex-Minister, GoK was the chief guest. U.B. Venkatesh, Shri. K. C. Kondaiah, Members, Vidahanaparishad, Shri Eshwar Kandhre, Working president of KPCC were the other dignitaries present in the function.

Currently, nearly 15,500 beneficiaries of Davangere district have received covishield vaccination free of cost. Along with this, vaccination service is also provided in SSIMSRC, Davangere. Till now, around 3300 were vaccinated with covishield in the institution.

CLINICO-HISTOPATHOLOGICAL CORRELATION OF GRANULOMAANNULARE: A CASE SERIES

INTRODUCTION:

Granuloma annulare is a cutaneous granulomatous disease of unknown aetiology. It is benign and often self limiting. It presents as erythematous papules/plaques arranged in an annular configuration.


Localized GA is the most common presentation, others include generalized, perforating, patch and subcutaneous types. It is associated with DM, thyroid disease, mild trauma, hyperlipidemia, infections, vaccines, malignancies and drugs (TNF alpha inhibitors).

CASE 1 :

• A 58 year old male patient presented with asymptomatic skin lesions over the chest since 2 years.


Case Reports


- Examination revealed a solitary non-tender erythematous annular plaque over the chest.
- Biopsy showed features of interstitial type of granuloma annulare.



CASE 2 :


- A 35 year old female patient presented with asymptomatic skin lesions over both the feet since 1 year.
- On examination non-tender erythematous annular plaques were noted over the dorsum of both the feet.
- Biopsy showed features of interstitial or incomplete form of granuloma annulare.





CASE 3 :

- A 50 year old female patient presented with asymptomatic skin lesions over the chest since 2 years.
- Examination revealed multiple non-tender erythematous papules arranged in annular configuration over the chest.
- Biopsy showed features of interstitial type of granuloma annulare.



TO SUMMARIZE... All these above cases are of localized form of granuloma annulare, which is the most common clinical variant. Biopsies of these cases revealed interstitial type of Granuloma annulare, which is the most common histopathological finding. The cases were treated with Tacrolimus 0.1% ointment.

DISCUSSION:

Granuloma annulare is a benign and often self limiting condition, may affect any area of the body. The fingers, hands and feet are the areas most often affected. It can affect people of any age, but occurs most frequently in children and young adults and it occurs more often in females than males. Lesions can disappear spontaneously without sequelae, typically within several months to years.

Most cases don't require treatment. However, patients do seek treatment for cosmesis, reoccurence is common with all the modalities of treatment. Local therapy include topical corticosteroid, topical calcineurin inhibitors, imiquimod cream, intralesional steroid injection, cryotherapy and laser ablation. Systemic therapy may be considered in widespread (Disseminated) GA, which includes systemic steroids, isotretinoin, methotrexate, dapsone, hydroxychloroquine, cyclosporine, PUVA and photodynamic therapy.

A case of Severe maxillofacial injury with Avulsin of medial canthal System Rt Eye:

Mr.Pavan Kumar 28y/M met with RTA on 30/6/20 due to hit by lorry while travelling in bike. He was admitted Under neurosurgery for initial head Injury management and Later referred to plastic Surgery for the management of Facial Injuries,

He had injury over the mid face with avulsion of right nostril part of nose, disruption of upper lip in the middle and avulsion of the medial canthal apparatus of upper and lower eye lids and Right Knee degloveinjury. With H/o loss of consciousness present, H/o nose and oral bleed present. No H/o vomiting and Ear bleed

Examination : Patient conscious, coherent, and well oriented with vitals within normal limits

Local Examination : There is a Deglove injury of right half of nose with laceration of alae and nostril, upper lip midline split laceration and Disruption of the medial canthal apparatus, visible fractured segments of the Right maxilla and Inferior orbital wall, anterior maxillary wall in to pieces. There is deglove injury over the right knee present with exposed patella.

CT scan Report : Fracture of the right Maxilla and over Right Inferior orbital wall, Mild extra axial haemorrhage at frontoparietal region

Patient was admitted and stabilised and immediately taken to surgery, Fixed the maxilla fractures with titanium plates , repaired the medial canthal ligament fixed to periosteum, Repaired the nasal alae, repaired the oral mucosa, repaired the Lip laceration in layers.Post operatively patient recovered well and wounds healed well.

Discussion :

Early surgery of the Facial wounds helps in healing and prevent necrosis of the Skin flaps , and prevent infection. Early fixation of facial bones are easy because of less muscle spasm

Primigravida with 35 weeks of gestation in labour with Tumefactive Demyelinating disorder and APLA PremaPrabhudev,Sapna I.S, Maheshwari.S Department of OBG, SSIMS AND RC,Davangere, Karnataka

Tumefactive Demyelinating Lesion(TDL) can be caused by Multiple Sclerosis and other diseases causing demyelination, inflammation, gliosis and axonal preservation. 2/3rds of them develop MS and relapsing disease.3 Primary Anti-Phospholipid Syndrome(APLA) is a rare disease causing thrombo-embolic events leading to RPL,PIH

Key Words - TDL, APLA, Pregnancy CASE REPORT

A 29 year old lady reported to SS Institute LR with h/o 8MOA and pain abdomen one day prior. She is married for 1 year & conceived spontaneously. She was diagnosed with TDL & APLA on treatment from 3rd month of pregnancy.



In 2015, Patient was diagnosed with TDL of left parietal lobe at NIMHANS &was started on IV Methylprednesolone OD 5 doses and discharged with Tab Wysolone 30mg OD for 6 weeks in tapering doses. Two months later was APLA positive for which she was on oral anticoagulants, steroids 10 mg. In 2018 February, she had right eye Homonymous Hemianopia and was treated with steroids. In Jan 2019 she again was APLA positive

Clinically patient was stable. Systemic examination was normal. Uterus was 34wk gestation with regular foetal heart rate & was in labour.Later due to fetal distress Emergency Caeserean was done& extracted live, female, active baby on 20/07/2020. Patient was discharged with advice for regular follow up with neurophysician& for barrier contraception.

DISCUSSION

TDL is a rare, highly heterogeneous, fulminant form of MS involving large areas of white matter. Incidence is 0.3/100000. APLA results due to cross reacting autoantibodies. Here we report the first case of MS with tumefactive configuration, atypical clinical and neuroimaging features with pregnancy. It is challenging as it mimics strokes, tumors or abscess. 10% with TMS develop visual defects. TMS is diagnosed if mass >2cm, vasogenic oedema, ring enhancement, restricted diffusion & T2 hypointensity.

CONCLUSION

Tumefactive disorder within the pregnant population confers diagnostic and therapeutic challenges due to its rarity of occurrence, clinical similarity to several neurologic presentations and paucity of established evaluation and treatment guidelines.

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Case report Horizontal gaze palsy with progressive scoliosis.

Horizontal gaze palsy with progressive scoliosis is an autosomal recessive disorder. It is characterized by the presence of congenital absence of conjugate horizontal eye movements. There is progressing scoliosis which aggravates with progressing age. It occurs due to mutation in ROBO 3 gene/chromosome 11q23-q25. Mri brain was done which showed hypoplastic pons with absence of the bulging contour of the facial colliculi, dorsal mid-line cleft (split pons sign) and Butterfly shaped hypoplastic medulla.

Case report

21 year old male Jagadeesh came with complaints on involuntary movements of left upper limb since 15 days. Patient also had kyphoscoliosis which was observed on general physical examination. Patient had intermittent episodes of fever. Patient also had cough with scanty expectoration. He was born of a consanguineous marriage. On general physical examination the patient had kyphoscoliosis and short stature. CNS examination, the patient had restriction of eye movements in both adduction and abduction.

Complete blood count was performed which showed aHb of 13.7mg/dl, total wbc count of 10120 cells/cumm. Neutrophils 54% lymphocytes 36% platelets of 1.20 lakhs/cumm. Aslo titre was also performed which was 331.5 IU/ml. Crp was 3.50 mg/l. 2d echocardiography was performed which showed normal chambers, grade 1 mitral regurgitation. Normal pulmonary artery pressure. No regional wall motional abnormality.1 LVEF-60%. The anterior mitral valve leaflet showed calcification of the tip.

Genetic testing was done which showed

The patient diagnosed to have familial horizontal gaze palsy with progressive scoliosis -Patient was treated with penicillin group of antibiotics, anti-epileptics and mucolytics. As the patient improved and was discharged with oral medications.



As and when queries raised or problems occurred during this HI program, were solved by Nodal officer and Master Trainers in coordination with RGUHS & Govt. of Karnataka. All the students were guided and closely monitored by the Master Trainers regarding their performance. At the end of eachday students were supposed to send their performance list. In this way we could keep all the students performance under track. This was one of the reasons for the SSIMS & RC Medical College stood top 2 in the rankingout of 45 Medical colleges in Karnataka.

Dr. Basavarajappa M, Nodal officer & Dr. Harish Kumar V S., Master Trainer regularly attended online weekly review meetings; further training programs and other emergency meetings conducted by Govt. of Karnataka, RGUHS and updated the information to final year MBBS students and Level 2 Doctors.

Triaging, Treatment and Counseling:

Triaging - Patients with Covid-19+ve were categorized into A, B, C, D & E categories based on the symptom severity (ICMR guidelines).

Category A consisted of Positive Asymptomatic patients. Category B consisted of patients with mild Covidsymptoms. Category C consisted of symptomatic patients with comorbidities, Category D consisted of patients with Pneumonia without respiratory failure (SPO2 > 94%) Category Econsisted of patients with Pneumonia who were in respiratory failure (SPO2 < 94%) and Category F consisted of Pneumonia with respiratory failure (SPO2 < 90 on room air) with sepsis/septic shock/multiorgan dysfunction.

Eligibility for Home Isolation - Asymptomatic/ mild cases (Cat A&B), who had requisite facility at home, with a 24 X 7 care giver who had regular communication with the hospital.

Escalation of the patients to Specialist/level 2 doctors and shifting the patients to the hospital - Students were trained by Master Trainers to pick up **RED FLAG SIGNS** like falling saturation rate (SPO2 < 94%), continuing fever, difficulty in breathing (RR > 30/ MIN), Altered mental status and any signs of end organ damage. These patients were triaged to the next level of care (Specialist/level 2 doctors). However if the condition of the patient was very sever then the students were asked to escalate the call and help in shifting the patients to the hospital.

Treatment and Counseling - Students were trained to follow ICMR treatment guidelines for HI patients and counsel them to uplift their moral to overcome Covid-19 successfully.

Completion of Home Isolation and Discharge was declared after the completion of 17 days.

Since, May first week every Thursday review meetings of Home Isolation program were conducted through Google meet at SSIMS & RC to address any issues and to know the progress of the program from the final year MBBS students and Level 2 doctors.

Till30thJune 2021, our students have Triaged, Treated and Counselled more than 45,000 Covid-19+ve Home Isolation Patients throughout Karnataka. Home Isolation counselling by our students was very effective and supportive. It was apsychological boost to the patients at home and timely suggestions and medical help were given. Even students had a very proud moment and experience of satisfaction when they received a positive feedback and appreciation from the patients.
