


Figure 1: Department wise reported ADRs




Figure 2: ADRs profile of reported drug

The ADRs were categorized according to WHO's System Organ Class Classification. The profiles of drugs are given in the Figure 2.

Out of 10 drugs, most commonly observed Adverse Drug Reactions were related to skin and appendages disorders, Gastrointestinal and cardiovascular and blood events (30% each) Table 1.

GLAUCOMA WEEK

"Uniting for a Glaucoma-Free World" at SSIMS, Davangere

The **Department of Ophthalmology at SSIMS and RC** spearheaded an initiative to raise awareness about Glaucoma through a series of community screening camps and health drives. Under the leadership of **Dr. Ajay S. Hatti**, Head of the Department and Professor, and **Dr. Renuka Barki**, Professor and with the dedicated involvement of the department's staff, postgraduate students, and nursing personnel, the initiative under the aegis of S S Care Trust successfully reached both the general public and institutional staff. The evaluation process included measuring **Intraocular pressure (IOP)** and performing **Dilated fundoscopic examinations** and those individuals requiring further evaluation were counseled and referred to **S.S. Institute of Medical Sciences (SSIMS)** for advanced care.

The Department of Ophthalmology conducted health and glaucoma screening camps at Sri Sidharudha Vruddhashrama (Old Age Home), Basavapatna, and Sri Shakti Old Age Home, Harihar, screening **over 80 individuals.** Additionally, a focused screening drive was carried out for **140 SSIMS staff members**, which involved comprehensive eye checks including IOP testing, optic disc evaluation, and provision of corrective spectacles when needed.

This initiative, led by the Department of Ophthalmology, was aimed at enhancing public understanding of glaucoma, **promoting early detection through regular screenings** and encouraging routine eye examinations. The success of the program was a result of the department's commitment, expert guidance and the enthusiastic response from the community.



Glaucoma Awareness - 10 Key Points You Should Know:

- **1. Glaucoma is a leading cause of irreversible blindness** in India, affecting over 11 million people aged 40 and above.
- **2.** Over 90% of cases go undiagnosed due to lack of awareness, poor screening, and limited access to eye care-especially in rural areas.
- **3. Known as the "Silent Thief of Sight,"** glaucoma often causes no pain and no symptoms until advanced stages, making regular checkups essential.
- **4. Glaucoma damages the optic nerve** due to increased eye pressure, leading to progressive and permanent visual field loss.
- 5. It typically causes **peripheral vision loss**, creating a tunnel-like field of vision.
- **6. Risk factors** include: age over 40, family history, diabetes, hypertension, long-term steroid use, and prior eye injuries or surgeries.
- 7. If untreated, glaucoma can lead to total blindness-but early detection and timely treatment can preserve vision.
- **8.** Annual eye check-ups after age of 40 are critical, especially for those with risk factors-consult an eye specialist regularly.
- **9. Treatment options include:** medicated eye drops, laser procedures, and advanced surgical techniques like glaucoma drainage implants.
- **10. Regular screening and follow-up** are your best defense against vision loss-don't wait for symptoms, get your eyes checked!







Visual Screening of Intellectually Disabled Children

The visual screening of intellectually disabled children was organised by Department of Ophthalmology, S.S.I.M.S. & R.C, Davangere, on behalf of S.S. Care trust from 12/11/2024 to 02/01/2025 on 5 days under the guidance & supervision of our Paediatric Ophthalmologist Professor Dr. Renuka Barki, in Asha Kirana School for Intellectually disabled, SS layout, A block, Davangere. A total of 140 children were screened in a span of 5 days out of which 22 children with requirement of additional detailed eye evaluation for visual indications like strabismus posterior segment abnormality were referred to our OPD and evaluated thoroughly. In 22 children ,14 children were diagnosed of strabismus correction through surgery was counseled to their caregivers, 2 high myopes were advised precise spectacle correction after thorough refraction, 2 glaucoma suspects were advised yearly IOP and Optic Disc evaluation. A case of retinitis pigmentosa was prescribed suitable low vision aids to help with night vision and care givers were educated regarding the need for family screening of 1st degree relatives, one case of cerebral visual impairment was advised appropriate visual stimulation excercises and care givers were counseled in that regard.



Case Report

FLUOROSCOPY-GUIDED GANGLION IMPAR BLOCKADE FOR CHRONIC TRAUMATIC COCCYGODYNIA

Introduction:

Coccygodynia is pain localized to the distal spine, typically resulting from trauma or prolonged sitting. Initial management includes conservative measures. In cases unresponsive to these treatments, interventional procedures like ganglion impar blockade are considered. The ganglion impar, located anterior to the sacrococcygeal junction, provides sympathetic and nociceptive innervation to the perineum. Its blockade offers effective pain relief in chronic coccygodynia, perineal/genital pain of benign or malignant origin, and pelvic pain syndromes.

A 44-year-old male with no known co morbidities, presented with persistent coccygeal pain for over six months. His symptoms were exacerbated by prolonged sitting and by transitioning from sitting to standing. Despite conservative treatments, including medications and physiotherapy, his pain persisted and was rated 8/10 on the Visual Analog Scale (VAS).

He underwent a ganglion impar block via the transsacrococcygeal approach using fluoroscopic guidance.

Procedure:

Patient shifted to operation theatre, after attachment of routine monitors, 20G peripheral IV was secured. Patient in prone position. Initial local infiltration with 2% lidocaine was given. A 22G spinal needle was advanced through the sacrococcygeal junction under fluoroscopy guidance. After confirming proper needle placement using dye spread, 4 cc of 0.25% bupivacaine with 40 mg of methylprednisolone was injected.





Outcome:

Remarkable pain relief was reported within 2 minutes of the procedure.

Pain scores improved progressively:4/10 at 1 hour, 6/10 at 6 and 24 hours, 3/10 at 1 month, 4/10 at 6 months

Discussion:

Coccygodynia, or tailbone pain, is discomfort at the distal spine, usually caused by trauma (like a fall) or repetitive microtrauma from prolonged sitting. This results in inflammation, pain, and difficulty sitting or changing positions.

First-line management is conservative, including:

NSAIDs

- Local analgesics
- Cushions
- TENS
- Physiotherapy

When these fail, interventional options like ganglion impar blockade are considered.

The ganglion impar is a solitary sympathetic ganglion at the sacrococcygeal junction, supplying sympathetic and nociceptive fibres to the perineum, including the anus, rectum, vulva, and distal urethra.

Ganglion impar block is effective for:

- Chronic coccygodynia
- Perineal/genital pain (benign or malignant)
- Pelvic pain syndromes

Traditional approaches to the ganglion impar often use curved or bent needles, which can increase the risk of complications and discomfort. The straight needle technique through the sacrococcygeal ligament is:

- Safer
- Easier to perform
- Associated with fewer side effects
- More comfortable for the patient

This technique is minimally invasive, avoids surgical risks, and can be learned and implemented effectively with fluoroscopic guidance. In this case, it resulted in both immediate and sustained pain relief over six months, demonstrating its effectiveness in managing chronic coccygeal pain.

Conclusion:

Ganglion impar block, especially when performed via the fluoroscopy-guided trans-sacrococcygeal approach, is a safe, simple, and effective intervention for patients with chronic traumatic coccygodynia who do not respond to conservative therapies.

The block not only provides significant immediate relief, but may also offer long-term pain control when combined with rehabilitation measures, such as physiotherapy, posture correction, and ergonomic adaptations.
