A case of chronic SDH posted for emergency evacuation under scalp block.

Introduction :


Chronic subdural hematoma is a common neurosurgical emergency presenting to the operating room for evacuation of the hematoma by burr hole. They present with unique anesthetic challenges. The need for immobility, stable perioperative hemodynamics, attenuation of response to painful stimuli, the prevention of straining and brain bulge as well as early responsiveness, are of paramount importance for a good outcome. Perioperative hemodynamic variations manifesting as hypertension or hypotension may be associated with cerebral edema, re-accumulation of hematoma, infarction, seizures and intracerebral hemorrhage.

Perioperative agitation and non-cooperation produces inadequate surgical conditions for the surgeon. General anesthesia usually has a higher risk in the elderly patients, especially in those with coexisting systemic disease. Scalp nerve block is a reliable alternative.

Case report :



74 years male known diabetic since 32 years on insulin with H/O self-fall 45 days ago and was diagnosed with acute SDH in right fronto-temporo-parietal region which was managed conservatively earlier presented with complaints of low mood, urinary incontinence since one day and altered sensorium, vomiting 2 episodes since 2 hours suggestive of raised ICP to our casualty.

On examination the patient GCS was E4V4M5 with stable vitals. CT brain was performed which showed bilateral fronto-temporo-parietal SDH with mass effect which required emergency evacuation by bilateral burr hole tapping.



Scalp block was planned for this patient on arrival to operating room monitors like ECG, pulse oximeter, NIBP, capnogram were connected, oxygen supplemented with face mask. Premedicated with glycopyrolate 0.2mg, fentanyl 100µg, dexamethasone 8mg, ondansetron 4mg and pantaprazole 40mg. ryles tube inserted and aspirated. Bilateral scalp block was performed with 2% lignocaine with adrenaline 1:2 lakh dilution and 0.5% bupivacaine 3-5 ml at each site by landmark technique. Burr hole tapping was done at 4 sites in total. Patient did not require any further sedation or other anesthetic intervention through out the procedure patient's hemodynamics were stable, and post procedure his GCS was 15/15.

NERVES BLOCKED	LAND MARK
Supraorbital nerve	Supraorbital notch
Supratrochlear nerve	Superiomedial angle of orbit
Zygomatico - temporal nerve	Supraorbital margin to posterior part of zygomatic arch
Auriculo-temporal nerve	1 cm anterior to tragus
Greater occipital nerve	Medial 1/3 rd on the line drawn between occipital protuberance and mastoid process
Lesser occipital nerve	Lateral 1/3 rd on the line drawn between occipital protuberance and mastoid process



Discussion :

General anesthesia is commonly used for burr hole tapping. In elderly patients with co morbidities scalp block is a safe alternative. With scalp block, the raise in ICP during laryngoscopy for endotracheal intubation can be prevented especially in patients who are presenting with raised ICP features, further it provides post-operative analgesia, GCS can be assessed immediate post procedure, greater patient and surgeon satisfaction.

Conclusion :

Chronic subdural hematoma is one of the life threatening condition. It requires emergency surgery either burr hole tapping or craniotomy. The mode of anesthesia is one of the critical step in the outcome of chronic subdural hematoma surgery by burr hole tapping. Scalp block is better alternative to general anesthesia in elderly patients with comorbidities.





Brief Report of AOIK (Virtual PG Edition) Conference




Young dermatologist award
